

## Frozen Planet: Polar Regions

English As readers & writers we will be sharing the texts 'The Ice Bear' by Nicola Davies and 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers. Children will be writing nonchronological reports about different polar animals. We will be considering all of the different types of information that need to be included and how to correctly lay out a report. To help us further, we will be watching video clips from documentaries and listening carefully to the interesting facts and the factual language. We will also be writing an adventure story. In **PE** we will be providing different PE sessions each week on our timetable of activities. You can always join in with Joe Wicks PE every Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings. Remember to try to keep active in Lockdown and stay safe. Weekly walks can be done by EVERYONE! Our **PSHE** unit is 'It's OK to not be OK'

As **Scientists** we will find out about habitats, classification of animals and their adaption to their habitats. We'll also study food chains and investigate the best ways of keeping warm in polar regions. **History** – if we have time, we will try to find out about the lives of 2 famous Polar explorers, Ernest Shackleton and Captain RF Scott.

**Geography** - We will be using maps to identify and name the 5 Oceans and 7 Continents. We will have a special focus on The Polar region and their weather, comparing it to the weather we have in England and what that means for the people and animals who live in the Arctic and Antarctica. **Computing** - we will be learning about algorithms and other computing vocabulary **RE** - This term we will be studying Judaism

Art and Design: We will be creating beautiful pictures of some animals we find in the polar regions. Design Technology We will be exploring some exciting waring recipes

Music – We will be following the Oak Academy scheme - Understanding Pulse.
