English As readers & writers two of the texts we will be sharing are 'Bob the Man on the Moon' by Simon Bartram and 'Beeau' by Alexis Deacon. Children will be making predictions about the stories and using their inference skills to discuss their ideas. They will be doing a range of writing that includes character descriptions and diary entries and we may also explore narratives, letters and instructions. In Book Week, we will be focussing on the text 'Aliens Love Underpants' by Claire Freedman and Ben Cort. Our Guided Reading text is 'Back to Earth with a Bump' and we will be developing our comprehension skills.

In PE we will be outdoors as much as possible. Our PE days are Thursday and Friday and children should please come into school on those days dressed in their PE kits. Long hairs should be tied up please.

Our PSHE unit is 'Friendship' focussing on qualities of a good friend, kindness, listening and forgiveness. As **Scientists** we will be studying space including our solar system, the planets and the stars.

History – We will be finding out about some of the people who have travelled in to space.

Geography – We will be studying settlements, both near and far.

Computing – We will be creating, testing and debugging algorithms.

RE – We shall be finishing Judaism and then looking at how and why do Christians celebrate Easter? **Music** – We will listen to some of The Planet suite by Holst and begin looking at Pitch **Art and Design:** We will be studying Space Art

Design Technology We hope to make some flying saucer pancakes and some mechanical moving pictures.

Discussing books, answering questions and developing comprehension skills is really important and recording this in reading records is helpful. **Key skills**: We may also send home learning to reinforce key skills, such as spellings, handwriting, maths, grammar, punctuation or times tables.
